Autumn Shades

Cover the pattern with either greaseproof paper or plastic, then following the design assemble the quilled shapes in position and stick them to each other. When the glue has dried, remove the design, turn it over and dab small amounts of glue on to the solid areas of quilling, then stick it in place on your background.

Making the shapes:

Peg (a,b,c)

Put the tip of the paper into the slot in the tool and roll up tightly. Keeping the coil tight on the tool stick down the end of the paper and remove carefully.

Eye (d,e,f)

Roll up the paper as for the peg, but this time allow the coil to unwind on the tool and fall off freely making a loose coil. Close the coil by sticking down the end of the paper and pinch a point at this end.

Petal (g,h)

Make an eye shape and curve the pinched point.

Leaf (i,j,k)

Make a closed loose coil, pinch points at both ends and curve them in opposite directions.

3-coil (l)

Fold the paper in half giving three ends, roll each of these into loose coils. The coils may be made even looser by stretching then with the point of the tool or cocktail stick.
